Kelowna General Hospital's Addiction Medicine Consult Team (AMCT) is a team of addiction medicine specialists who assess and provide evidence-based treatment for patients with substance use disorders while admitted, or in the emergency department, at KGH. The team is typically comprised of **Dr. Ewelina Zaremba, Dr. Leslie Lappalainen, Dr. Nicholas Baldwin and Dr. Megan Hill**. At times the team is joined by locums and residents.

Despite being acutely short-handed as a service during the onset of COVID, the AMCT increased on-site physician hours during the unprecedented high volume of hospital presentations for substance use related issues. In particular, Dr. Ewelina Zaremba, took many extra shifts to help provide gaps in service coverage and remained a mainstay on the team. Dr. Baldwin and Dr. Hill also worked tirelessly to help support the service needs at KGH, in addition to their regular community work at MHSU and Outreach Urban Health. The team recognized early on in the pandemic that patients with substance use disorders.....[click here for the full story!](#)



Dr. Aleks Tkach (pictured left) led the development of the IH Endovascular Thrombectomy service design and implementation that started with documenting the impact to patients and families who did not have access to this standard of stroke care. This created a supportive case that IH had the physician expertise (Neurology, Interventional Radiology and Intensivist) to provide safe procedural care and worked with the appropriate health authority executive and administrative structure to put in place the financial and support structures, often engaging personally to find solutions to resourcing, changing physician practice, and addressing barriers to care such as transportation, imaging, and the tools to enable early response IH wide.

PET/CT Scanner / Monitors

World-class PET/CT Scanner Now in Kelowna! Positron emission tomography (PET) imaging is a procedure that, when combined with computed tomography (CT), help physicians to more accurately diagnose and manage disease, especially cancer. **Dr. Silvia Riccio and Dr. Gary Kindrachuk** (pictured left), are two of the physicians who helped establish and now run this new service. This critical tool in cancer diagnosis is located in the BC Cancer Agency facility, adjacent to Medical Imaging in KGH, which includes waiting and exam rooms. Dr. Riccio notes, "We are thrilled to be performing PET/CT imaging in Kelowna with our new state-of-the-art scanner. Oncology patients in our health region can now get the imaging they need much closer to home."

It is expected that this will affect more than 1,000 Interior patients who were previously forced to go to the Lower Mainland where the province's only two publicly-funded PET/CT scanners are located.
